Bill and Ben the high flying men. London one day, New York the next. Conference calls in Dallas and Denver, public relations in Miami and Milan.

"Bill", says Ben, "I have been traveling so much lately that I am finding it hard to get time to enter my itineraries into my Palm device. Grafitti can be a little bit slow in those times when I am really rushed. Do you ever have this problem?"

"Well Ben, " says Bill, "I used to but now I have found a solution it's called 'MyTimeTraveler'. Let me give you a quick tour. First we go to <http://www.mytimetraveler.com/>"

"Now, " says Bill, "because you are a new user you will go to the 'New Users' column on the right hand side of the screen but you will of course use the 'Existing Users' column everytime you use MyTimeTraveler after this. You will also notice that there is an 'Overview and Demonstration' available if you need it."

"Ah yes, I might have a look at that later."

"Good idea Ben. Now let's start by entering our user name and then our password twice to ensure no mistakes are made. Now click on the 'Register, it's FREE' button and we will be taken through to the next screen. Now on this screen we go down to the 'Your Itinerary' section and click on the 'continue as' prompt."

"It's as easy as that Ben, now all you have to do is click on the buttons according to the information you wish to add. For example if you click on the 'Flight/Ship' button a screen will appear where you can enter flight details. Now all you have to do is simply fill out the fields."

"Oh that's great Bill," says Ben. "So say I am traveling from New York to Providence I enter the flight number and then 'New York' and the departure date and time in the 'Departure Information' section and 'Providence' etc. for the 'Arrival Information' section."

"That's it Ben," says Bill, "now just click on the 'Save' button."

"Oh no Bill it tells me in green at the top of the screen to 'address issues that have been highlighted below'."

"Yes Ben but don't worry, the red text below will tell you what and where the problem is".

"Ah I see Bill, what I need to do is inform MyTimeTraveler of the nearest city or time zone since Providence is not a time zone it knows about."

Ben quickly makes the modification.

"Now all I need to do is to get the itinerary on to my Palm, says Ben.

"This bit is fun. All you need to do Ben is click on the 'Synchronize Itinerary' button on the left hand side of the screen. Now given that you do not already have TravelSync you will need to download it on to your device. Simply scroll down to the 'Never Synchronized' section and click on 'Download TravelSync'. This won't take long and then you'll

be able to download your itinerary by clicking on 'Download Itinerary'. Your flight from New York to Providence will be automatically located in Time Travel and the Palm Date Book. If you had accomodation and car hire details then they will go straight to your Date Book and Palm Address Book."

"Ben there are loads of other features that I really want to tell you about, like getting your assistant to enter things for you, and sharing your itinerary with others so that they can see where you are while traveling. Right now though, I have a flight to catch so we will have to wait until next time we speak or you can just play with MyTimeTraveler and explore. Here's to not having enough time to enter travel information!"

Clink go the coffee cups as we leave Bill and Ben in the busy airport lounges of La Guardia until next time.



Time Traveler Tip #1

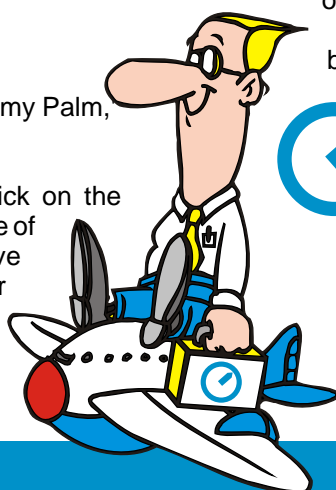
When you are creating an entry in any of Time Traveler's three applications, Time Travel, Time Book and Time Place, there is a shortcut that you can use for creating the next entry. Normally you may be tapping on 'Done' which will take you back to the main screen and here you will need to tap on 'New' to create your next entry. Instead when you have created an entry tap on the 'Menu' icon (next to the alphabetic box at the bottom of the screen) and then tap on 'New' which appears in the box at the top of the screen. This process can be made even quicker if you simply write 'shortcut' (a forward slash) then 'n' in the alphabetic box at the bottom of your screen.

Time Traveler Tip #2

Did you know that you can copy itineraries from Time Travel into other applications on your handheld computer? This can be extremely useful if you wish to communicate your itineraries to others.

When you are in the itinerary screen of Time Travel, tap on the 'Menu' icon. When the menu appears at the top of the screen tap on 'Edit' and then 'Copy Itinerary'. Now go into another application, for example your Memo Pad, press on 'New', tap on the 'Menu' icon again, tap on 'Edit' and then 'Paste'.

This process can be made even quicker if you take full advantage of the shortcut option. When you wish to copy your itinerary you can simply do so by writing 'shortcut' (a forward slash) then 'c' in the alphabetic box at the bottom of the screen. When you wish to paste your itinerary in another application you can do so by writing 'shortcut' then 'p'.
