Bill and Ben the Time Traveling Men

Bill and Ben the high flying men. London one day, New York the next. Conference calls in Dallas and Denver, public relations in Miami and Milan.

"Bill," says Ben, "in the last Time Traveler news letter I learnt how you can allocate one of the buttons to Time Place and Time Travel and that has been very useful because it allows me to access Time Traveler very quickly."

"That's great Ben," replies Bill.

"But Bill," continues Ben, "what about Time Book, I use it all the time but I cannot access it as easily as Time Place and Time Travel."

"Ah Ben but you can, let me show you. All you have to do is use Time Traveler's 'Go To' function which acts as a brief reminder of what each of TT's applications does and allows you to swap between the applications quickly. For example Ben, if you are in Time Place tap on the Menu icon which is located at the bottom of the screen on the left of the graffiti area. Tap on 'Options' at the top of the screen and at the bottom of the 'Options' box you will see two 'Go To' choices. If you tap on 'Go To Time Zone Events', Time Book will appear. If you tap on 'Go To Itinerary', Time Travel will appear. Alternatively if you are in Time Travel or Time Book and you tap on the Menu icon and then 'Options', one of the 'Go To' choices will be 'Go To World Time' and tapping on this option will take you back to Time Place."

"That's great, thank you Bill that will save me a lot of time," says Ben.

"Ah but wait Ben it can be even quicker than that because Time Traveler provides a shortcut for this function. By writing the shortcut stroke, a forward slash from the bottom left hand corner to the top right hand corner of the graffiti box, whilst in any of TT's three applications will cause a box to appear at the bottom of the screen. Tapping on and leaving your stylus on either of the two icons will bring up the brief explanation of the application. The book icon will say 'Go To Time Zone Event' and will take you into Time Book, the walking clock icon will say 'Go To Itinerary' and will take you to Time Travel, and the World icon will say 'Go To World Time' and will take you into Time Place. If you wish to go into one of the applications slide the stylus to that icon and then remove it. Voila Ben, how about that!"

* The 'Go To' menus are available on all Palm devices while the shortcut strokes are available on PalmOS 3.5 and later e.g. Palm IIIc, Palm VIIx, Palm Vx. You can check the version of Palm OS your device runs by using the 'Info' menu of the Application Launcher.

Time Traveler Tip

George Corrigan of San Francisco has written in with a very helpful shortcut for Time Book users.

If you go into the 'Preferences' menu of Time Book (TB) you will be presented with a number of choices. The preferences box asks you what Date Book events you would automatically like captured. If you choose to capture the 'Eligible Date Book Entries' then upon the synchronization of Time Book with the Date Book, TB will capture all your entries which have been made with brackets and a location within the brackets at the end. For example if you have an entry, 10:00 Conference Call (New York), then Time Book will capture this event for you. As you travel around the world, Time Book will keep this meeting at the correct local time. For example if you travel to London Time Book will change this entry to now say 3:00 Conference Call - 10:00am (New York) indicating that your conference call will occur at 3:00(pm) London time which is 10:00am in New York.

When you use this function a lot George suggests you can use your Palm's 'Shortcuts' option in order to enter what you need to into the brackets and this is a great time saver for all those who use Time Book in this way often. To do this tap on your 'Applications' icon at the bottom of the screen and then tap the 'Prefs' icon. Tap on the down arrow, which is located in the top right corner of your screen, and then select 'Shortcuts' from the list.

Now tap on 'New' and under 'Shortcut Name' enter your abbreviation. For example if you travel to New York a lot you may use 'ny' as its abbreviation. In George's case he abbreviates the different time zones. For example he may use 'est' as an abbreviation for 'EST/EDT - Eastern' or 'ast' for 'AST/ADT - Atlantic'.

After you have entered your abbreviation enter the 'Shortcut Text' as it is in Time Book. For example Eastern Standard Time is entered in Time Book as 'EST/EDT - Eastern' and your shortcut entry needs to correspond with the TB entry.

Now when you are in your date book, all you need to do is write: Conference call and 'est' and EST/EDT - Eastern will appear in the brackets saving you lots of time and key strokes.

NB. If you forget what the shortcut key is go into the 'Edit' menu and select 'Graffiti Help'. Scroll down once and in the bottom right corner of the screen it shows you how to write the 'Short Cut' keystroke.
