Bill and Ben the Time Traveling Men

Bill and Ben the high flying men. London one day, New York the next. Conference calls in Dallas and Denver, public relations in Miami and Milan.

“Bill”, says Ben, “next week I am traveling to Providence for a conference.”

“That’s nice for you Ben,” replies Bill.

“Yes it is, but Providence is not in my Time Place data base, what should I do?”

“Ah,” says Bill, “let me show you. See the four icons at the bottom of Time Place’s screen, well tap on the ‘List’ icon which is the one on the right. This will take you into Time Place’s ‘list screen’. Now tap on the ‘New’ icon which is also at the bottom of the screen. This will take you into Time Place’s ‘Edit Place’ screen. Now write ‘Providence’ into the ‘Description’ field. Are you with me so far?”

“Yes,” replies Ben.

“Now tap on the ‘Based On’ box where it says ‘Nowhere’,” continues Bill. “Time Place’s ‘Look Up’ screen will appear. In the top right hand corner of this screen you will see a down arrow accompanied by a word, tap on this and select ‘All’ from the list. Now from Time Place’s database you should select the place or time zone you would like to base your new city on. In this case you would base Providence on ‘EST’ or ‘EST/EDT-Eastern’, so tap on one of those. In the top right hand corner of your ‘Edit Place’ screen you will see a down arrow accompanied by a word (unfiled), tap on this and select a category you would like to add your new place to, in this case you would choose ‘Cities’. Now tap on ‘Done’ or you could tap on ‘Make Current’ if you wanted to make Providence your current time zone. Providence is now part of your Time Place data base.”

“That’s great,” says Ben. “Now can I make Providence appear on my world map?”

“Yes,” replies Bill, “Go back into Time Place’s clock screen by tapping on the ‘Clock’ icon at the bottom of the screen. Now tap on the box above the clock you wish to change and select Providence from Time Place’s ‘Look Up’ screen. Voila, Providence is now one of your clocks and it will also appear on your map. If you also enter Providence’s location into Time Place Then it would show at exactly that location on the map.”

“But Bill, I don’t know Providence’s latitude and longitude.”

“That’s OK Ben, Time Place will display it along the top of the screen as near as possible to Providence.”

Time Traveler Tip #1

Time Place’s new ‘map screen’ provides you with a quick and easy way of changing your current location, particularly if you do not have an itinerary determining when you arrive at a new location. When you are in this screen your current location is displayed along the bottom of the map. Tap on the location and you will be taken into a ‘Change Location’ box. Tap on the dotted box and Time Place’s ‘Look Up’ list will come up. Select the city you would like to make your current location and then tap on the ‘Change’ icon at the bottom of the ‘Change Location’ box. Your device will be updated to the new time zone immediately including the re-scheduling your Palm Date Book if you have Time Book installed.



Time Traveler Tip #2

You can make Time Place and Time Travel much easier to access by allocating them to one of your “hardware buttons” located on the bottom of your device. Go into your applications screen and select ‘Prefs’. Tap on the down arrow, which will be accompanied by a word, which you will find in the top right hand corner of your screen. You will be presented with a list and from here select ‘Buttons’. From the ‘Buttons’ screen select a button which you would like to allocate to Time Place/Time Travel (TP/TT). For example if you wish to allocate the ‘To Do List’ button (which is the second button from the right) to TP/TT then tap on the down arrow located next to this button’s icon. From the list select ‘Time Place’. Now press on the ‘To Do List’ button and it will take you straight into Time Place. If you press on it again it will take you into Time Travel and will help you to alternate between the two applications which is very useful when traveling. Your ‘To Do List’ button is now your ‘Time Place/Time Travel’ button.



Time Traveler Tip #3

If you tap on any of the dates on the right hand side of Time Travel’s Itinerary Screen you will be given the flight number and departure time of the leg of travel you have selected.
